- CAP was founded as the national advocacy organization for pathologists.
- We're set up as a 501(c)6 organization so we have unlimited lobbying capacity for our members.

Medicare's Efforts to Shift Reimbursement to Primary Care

- Over the last decade, health system changes have sought to invest more in primary care.
 - Back in 2007, increases to evaluation/management (E/M) services led to a -7% cut to pathology services.
- In 2019, CMS approved a proposal for E/M revaluation that will result in a redistribution of \$7 billion in Medicare payments from specialists to primary care physicians in 2021.
- Reversing and mitigating cuts to pathologists is the top priority for the CAP and our lobbying efforts.

Evaluation and Management (E/M) Services Change Is Driving Cuts to Specialists

- Estimated impact on pathologists in 2021:
 - -9% overall decrease to pathology services.
 - -\$113 million per year to partially fund the increases.
- Budget neutrality provisions in the Medicare program require offsets/cuts to pathologists, other specialists to fund increases to primary care services.



Evaluation and Management (E/M) Services Change Is Driving Cuts to Specialists

Advocacy to Fight the Medicare Cuts

- CAP Advocacy is working with the AMA and other physicians negatively affected by the cuts.
- We are asking Congress to mitigate the reductions to all non-E/M services by waiving budget neutrality.
- We are mobilizing pathologists to ask their members of Congress to support our specialty.

Advocacy to Fight the Medicare Cuts

- During the summer months, more than 40 CAP members virtually met with congressional offices.
- The CAP is a leader in a multi-specialty coalition pushing Congress to make all physicians whole by waiving budget neutrality.
 - Unspent moneys in the Provider Relief Fund could offset the costs for waiving budget neutrality for one year.
- The CAP is working with legislators in the House and Senate to introduce legislation and rally support for it.

Update on Advocacy to Fight the Medicare Cuts

- Reps. Bera and Bucshon led a signon letter to urge House leaders to stop the cuts.
 - 239 House members signed the letter.
- We are reviewing legislative proposals to delay the cut by one or two years.
 - Such a move would buy us additional time to determine a permanent fix to these reductions.

Dear Speaker Pelosi and Leader McCarthy,

We write to bring to your attention a matter of great urgency. The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services will be issuing new payment policies in the Medicare Physician Fee Schedule for 2021. The changes have many positive attributes, including improvements for maternity care and much-needed payment increases for physicians delivering primary and complex office-based care to some of our nation's most vulnerable patients.

Unfortunately, a statutory budget neutrality rule requires that any increases in Medicare payments for these office visits, also known as evaluation and management (E/M) services, must be offset by corresponding decreases. As a result, many specialists now face substantial cuts beginning on January 1, 2021, if Congress does not act before the end of the year. Payment cuts of this magnitude will surely strain a health care system that is already stressed by the COVID-19 pandemic and could jeopardize patient access to medically necessary services.

In order to safeguard beneficiaries' access to care during this pandemic, we as Congress should examine possible bipartisan solutions to address excessively steep cuts. We encourage you to incorporate the resulting policy changes in any upcoming legislation moving through the House.

Health care professionals across the spectrum are reeling from the effects of the COVID-19 emergency as they continue to serve patients during this global pandemic. Thank you for considering our request and for your continued leadership during these trying times.



- The molecular interpretation was identified as misvalued in 2018, and the CAP successfully worked to protect the value of the service.
- Working with the American Medical Association/Specialty Society Relative Value Update Committee, we recommended an increase to the physician work value of the service.
- The Medicare program agrees; and, for 2021, announced a payment increase of 124%!

Update on Legislation in Arizona

- We've accomplished a lot together through the years:
 - 2015: Direct access testing law, while ensuring liability immunity for pathologists
 - 2017: Out-of-network law
 - 2019: Secured changes to network adequacy rules for Medicaid managed care plans
 - 2019: Secure amendments to genetic testing law to remove informed consent requirement
- Great examples of a successful partnership between ASP-CAP!







Update on Legislation in Arizona

continued

- This year, we jointly contracted a lobbyist to pass additional amendments to the direct access testing law:
 - Amendments would ensure testing is subject to proficiency testing.
 - The state pharmacist association blocked our amendments, but we sought a compromise to disclose PT status when providing results to patients.
 - However, COVID-19 shutdown the legislative session before it could move forward.







CAP State Pathology Society Initiative

- We strongly believe in strengthening our relationships with state societies.
 - Together, we can successfully advocate for pathologists at the state and federal levels.
- The CAP has initiated a multiyear strategy to support state pathology societies.
 - For example, we launched a virtual meeting platform for state societies to use.




